

The Family Will

Safeguarding

For the safety of our young people we may need to share information with other agencies.

Some of our students need us to help them manage their own behaviour and this may include positive handling techniques. By signing this form you are giving permission for this to happen if and when necessary.

Any decision that the school makes, does so in the belief that they are acting in the best interests of the child.

Practicalities

We want all of our children to be active learners.

Children learn best when they are using all of their senses to learn. Sometimes we do very messy activities inside and out and we don't want to spoil 'best' clothes. Please don't send your child in or with precious things.

We ask you to send spare clothes, waterproofs, wellingtons and a coat, then sun cream and hats in summer to protect them from the weather.

We go out of school regularly and we would ask you to consent to your child doing a range of visits which may include residentials.

Attendance.

We can no longer authorise holidays or time off in term time unless there are exceptional reasons.

We report all our attendance data will need to refer any unauthorised attendance to the local authority.

If you have an appointment can you let us have a copy of the letter and try to make it for only half a day.

We are seeking to increase school attendance and want your support to make sure your child attends regularly.

Home and School Communication

We know that parents and families make the biggest difference to the lives of pupils.

We want to work as partners in your child's education and help to shape what they do when they are not at school.

It is important we communicate in many different ways:
